TO DO

- Contact a lawyer immediately and remain quiet until you retain a defense attorney;
- Write down your version of events and make a list of witnesses and involved parties;
- Ask friends and family for their support and potential assistance;
- Understand your bond conditions;
- Make a list of all your assets (jointly & individually);
- Stay involved in your case by checking in with your client concierge;

DO NOT

- Don't speak with law enforcement without an attorney;
- Don't attempt to

 "prove" your innocence
 to law enforcement;
- Don't speak with the complaining witness(es) or others who may share information with them;
- X Don't violate any conditions of your bond;
- Don't disregard the allegations against you as insignificant;
- Don't bury your head in the sand and hope the matter goes away on its own;

- Trust your lawyers and remember what you tell them remains confidential;
- Find a confident to talk to during this process (friend, family, professional);
- Familiarize yourself with the court process and consult additional resources on our website;
- Stay off social media and be careful of tech set up in your name;
- Maintain professionalism and comply with all current Court Orders;
- Remain confident that your lawyers are fighting for your best outcome;
- Decide what kind of person you want to be and exemplify through this matter for yourself, your children, your family!

- Don't use/abuse any illegal or prescription drugs or alcohol;
- Don't engage in conflict with the other party;
- Don't communicate with the Judge or the Court staff; Ever!
- Don't speak with others online who claim they know the law;
- Don't discuss your case
 on social media or post
 any details to your
 timeline;
- X Don't show up late to court or ignore Court Orders
- Don't overshare your legal positions or strategy with the other party;
